While many educational programs in New England offer music training for children, few match Project STEP's comprehensive approach, which provides high-quality, long-term training, support services, and scholarships specifically designed for children from backgrounds underrepresented in classical music. Our program's commitment to equity includes both economic access and the deeper work of supporting students of color in spaces that have historically excluded them, empowering them to excel as musicians, become confident and creative learners, and thrive as successful young adults.

Students engage with Project STEP for up to 12 years, during which they are consistently challenged to achieve and sustain high levels of musicianship. Throughout their journey, they develop perseverance, social and leadership skills, self-discipline, confidence, problem-solving abilities, and a strong work ethic. These qualities are invaluable both in their musical careers and beyond.

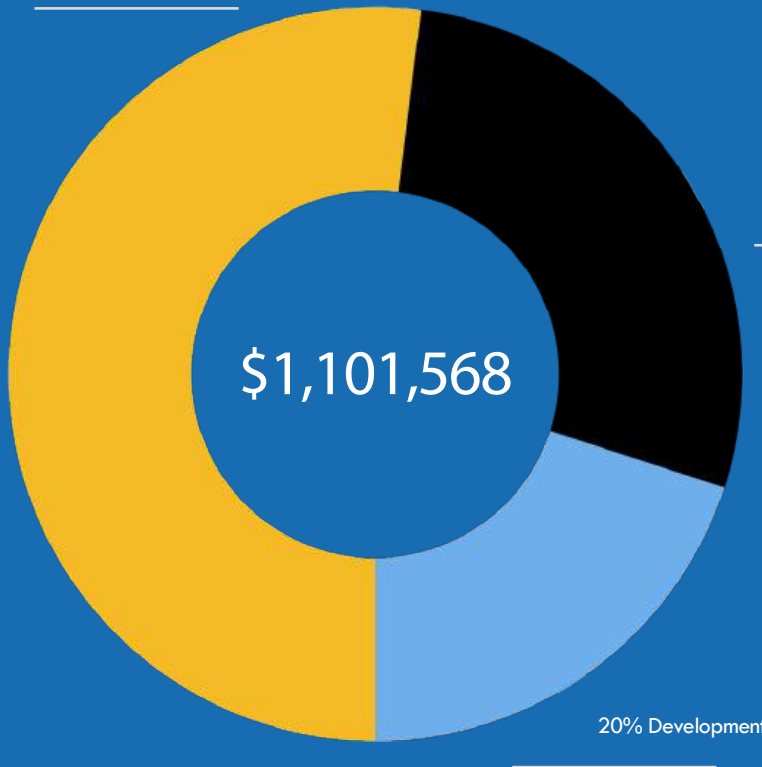
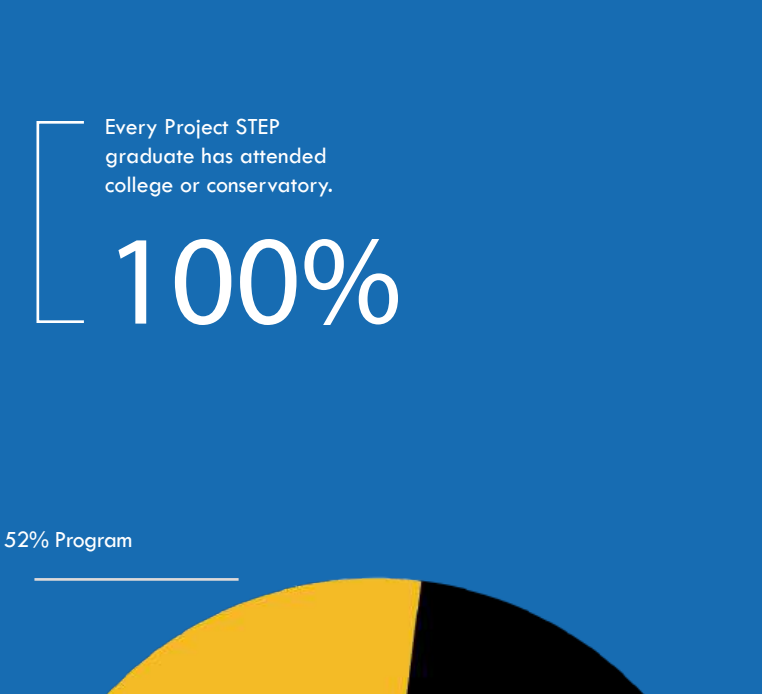

FOCUS PROGRAM: Early access to musical training, exposing children to different types of music and instruments. This program is offered for free to students in kindergarten/K2 who are underrepresented in classical music.

CORE PROGRAM: Provides students in grades 1-12 with a comprehensive classical string education. STEP offers up to 12 years of instruction and students receive an instrument, participate in workshops, masterclasses, a summer music camp, and orchestra. They benefit from numerous enrichment opportunities. The program provides ongoing, informed guidance tailored to each student's

individual needs. Students enter the Core Program either by progressing through our introductory FOCUS program or by audition. Both serve as intentional entry points through which we identify, nurture, and welcome young talent into the full STEP journey.

Project STEP works with the top musicians in the field to provide the very best education for our students. We have over 30 teaching artists from esteemed partnerships with NEC, BSO, A Far Cry, and Rivers Conservatory.

DID YOU KNOW?

Approximately 60 % of our graduates go into the music profession while others go into esteemed career paths such as engineering, mathematics, and healthcare.

Every student in the Project STEP program is able to use an instrument from our collection throughout their twelve years of musical training. Like Goldilocks, we have to find the right instrument for the right student, considering age, size, experience, and use. As the student grows, so does their instrument, and it is exchanged for the next perfect fit.

Highlights

Project STEP is the nation's first college and career pathway program for students from racial and ethnic backgrounds underrepresented in classical music.

Project STEP's student musicians have had an exceptional year, marked by remarkable achievements and growth. From standout solo performances to prestigious ensemble collaborations, their talent and dedication shone on every stage. Highlights of the year include performances at major cultural events, national competition recognitions, and several senior students being accepted into top conservatories and music programs. These milestones reflect Project STEP's enduring commitment to fostering excellence and equity in classical music.

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Concert

Project STEP students performed a commemorative community concert for over 100 guests in memory of Dr. King at Burnes Hall, New England Conservatory.

Street Stories with A Far Cry

Project STEP's Honors Group performed solo on stage, while a select group of students joined the Grammy-nominated orchestra A Far Cry at Jordan Hall for a side-by-side performance of Night Music of the Streets of Madrid by Luigi Boccherini (arr. Miki Cloud).

Sofía Hernández-Williams

Sofía Hernández-Williams, cello, grade 4, performed a solo with the Joy Of Music Program Youth Orchestra. Sofia left the audience in awe with her performance of Cello Concerto No. 1 in C Major, Hob. VIIb:1 by Joseph Haydn.

Daniel Bernard Roumain

Project STEP, Suzuki School of Newton, and composer/ musician Daniel Bernard Roumain presented a K-12 performance of an original composition on the theme of diversity in classical music. The performance highlighted the voices and stories of our community, continuing the work of making classical music a bridge towards equity.



Winsor Music

Winsor Music premiered the first-ever collective composition created by Project STEP students titled *Jamboard*. Winsor's Co-Artistic Directors Gabby Diaz and Rane Moore joined acclaimed composer deVon Russell Gray to work with STEP students in composing a violin, clarinet, and piano trio. They seamlessly stitched together themes from each student to make a new multi-movement composition.

Rockport Music

STEP students took the stage at Rockport Music's Shalin Liu Performance Center for an unforgettable concert featuring works by Black composers, including Xavier Foley and Walter Hawkins.

Castle of Our Skins

STEP students Suubi and Sokki Laurent performed in Castle of our Skins' (COOS) "Love & Justice" concert featuring chamber music works of Adolphus Hailstork III, who attended the event.

Rafael Popper-Keizer Masterclass

Hailed by The New York Times as "imaginative and eloquent," and described by The Boston Globe as "a local hero," cellist Rafael Popper-Keizer led a STEP masterclass, offering deep insight into expressive phrasing and performance.

Boston Society of the New Jerusalem

STEP student Caleb Graupera (cello), accompanied by Joy Cline Phinney (piano), performed works by Bach and Beethoven at the Boston Society of the New Jerusalem. Project STEP is honored to participate in the Carlton Doctor Scholarship, supported by BSNJ.

National Pathways Festival in Nashville, TN

Several Project STEP students were chosen for the the 2024 National Pathways Festival that convenes 60 talented pre-college musicians of color from Pathways programs across the country for a multi-day musical intensive. The Festival included side-by-side rehearsals and a performance with The Nashville Symphony Orchestra.

Boston Symphony Orchestra

Dr. Ian Saunders, Josué González, Josefina Guzmán, and members of STEP's Board of Directors attended the Boston Symphony Orchestra's Gala, where STEP alumna Njioma Chinyere Grevious (Class of 2017, violin)—a Sphinx Competition winner and Avery Fisher Career Grant recipient—performed as a featured soloist with the BSO, marking a proud milestone in her remarkable career.
